If you pay Income Tax at the higher or additional rate and want to receive the additional tax relief due to you, you must include all your Gift Aid donations on your Self Assessment tax return or ask HM Revenue and Customs to adjust your tax code.

Giving to



Most regular attenders give by Standing order and top up by cheque as and when they want.

The chancellor has made it even easier to stretch your giving. The Gift Aid scheme means that if you have paid enough income tax on what you give, we can claim that tax back from the government. A £100 donation means we will get £25 from the government, if you have signed our gift aid form.

The Gateway Church is a registered charity no 1120359.

So what is Gift Aid?

Gift Aid is the scheme under which you make donations to the Church, on which we claim back the income or capitals gains tax you have paid. For example a gift of £80 is worth £100 to the Church – that's the £100 you earned before you paid 20% tax on it!

How do I give via Gift Aid?

Just make a donation! Sign the Gift Aid declaration on the back of this leaflet and we will do the rest. One declaration covers every donation to the Church from the 1st May 2007 onwards. If you donate cash please use one of the envelopes on the welcome table and put your name on it so we can claim the tax back.

I want an easy way to give regularly!

Just pay by Standing order – a form is on this leaflet. Please pop it in the offering box and not return it to your bank! Then top-up your giving by cash or cheque whenever you want.

Are there any limits to what I can give?

None at all!!! But remember, in each tax year you must pay as much income or capital gains tax as we are going to claim back. We can remind you of your total giving if you ask.

Does it matter if I have a joint account?

No. The gift aid declaration has a section for you to declare that it is your money you are giving – please sign it. The person who makes the declaration should sign the cheques or standing order form.

What if I pay higher rate tax?

People who pay higher rate tax can get extra relief on their donations by writing to their tax office or declaring it on their tax return.

What if I am self employed?

Start with the total amount you want to give this tax year. Divide it by 80 and then multiply it by 100. This gives you the gross (before tax) value of your giving. Will you pay income tax or capital gains tax on at least that amount of your income over the year? If so you can safely give that amount.
